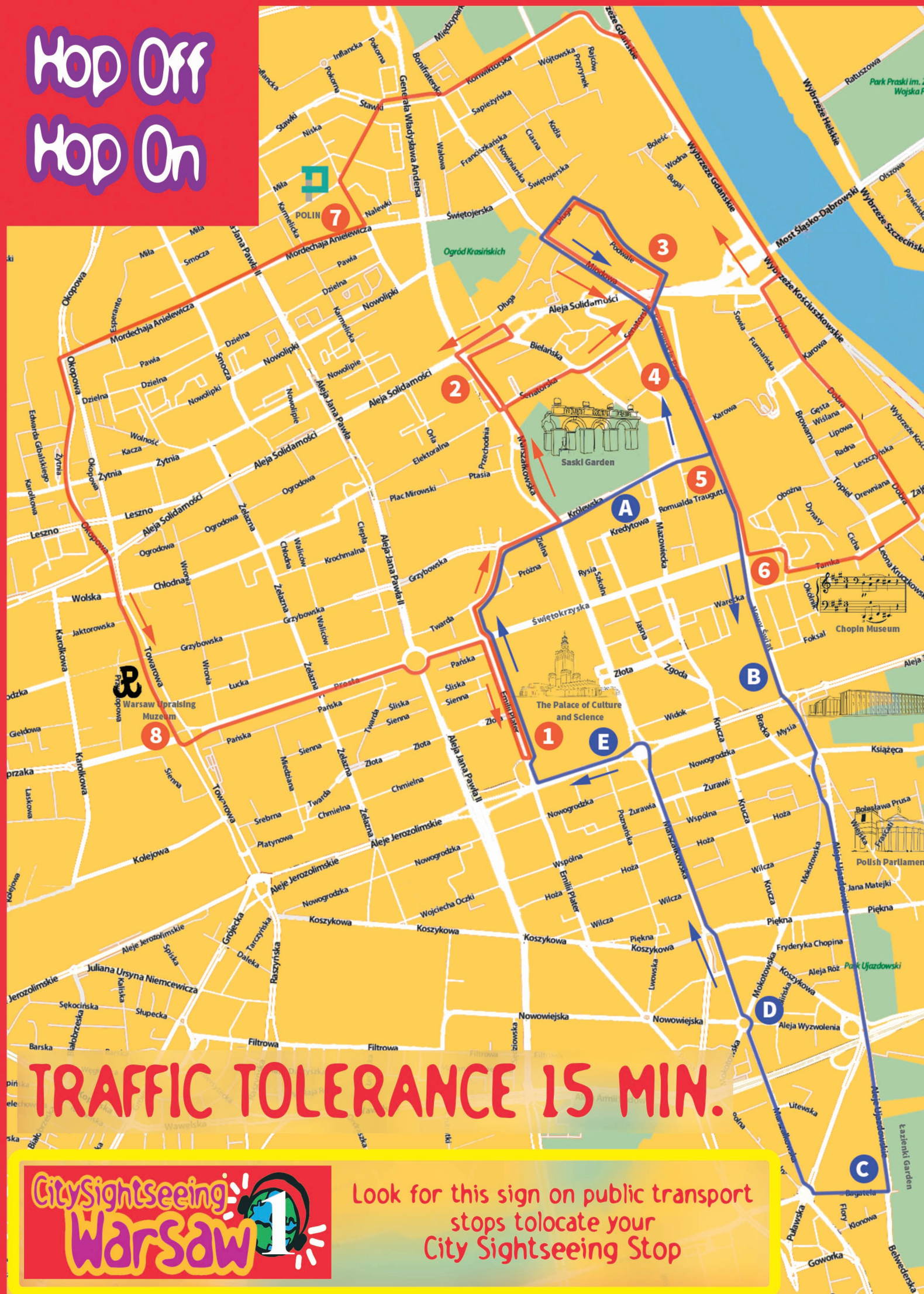

STOP 1.

Where is it?

Our main bus stop is located in E. Plater Street, on the public transportation stop, just before the traffic lights, opposite the central train station. Nearby are also the Marriott, Mercure and Intercontinental Hotels.

What to see?

Palace of Culture and Science; Golden Terraces Shopping Center; Museum of Modern Art.

STOP 2.

Where is it?

Stop number 2 is located at Bank Square in Marszałkowska Street, near the Town Hall. Nearby are the Theatre Square and the Saxon Gardens.

What to see?

Town Hall - the seat of Warsaw's President; Gardens and the Krasinski Palace; Monument to the Ghetto boundaries; Monument to the Heroes of Monte Cassino.

STOP 3.

Where is it?

Stop number 3 is located in Podwale Street by the Zygmunt the King Column. This is the most representative place of Warsaw with the Castle Square and the characteristic narrow streets of the Old Town. The area has many cafes and restaurants.

What to see?

Old Town; Old Town Square with the Royal Castle; Mariensztat Zygmunt the King Column; Krakowskie Przedmieście.

STOP 4.

Where is it?

Stop number 4 is in Krakowskie Przedmieście Street, which is a lovely Warsaw promenade with an interesting architecture. Nearby is the Bristol Hotel.

What to see?

Krakowskie Przedmieście Street; Old Town with the Royal Castle; Namiestnikowski Palace - the former seat of the President; Church of St. Anne; Pilsudski Square.

STOP 5.

Where is it?

Stop number 5 is located near Krakowskie Przedmieście Street. Nearby are the Bristol Hotel, Sofitel hotel and many interesting shops, cafes and restaurants.

What to see?

University of Warsaw; Statue of Nicolai Copernicus Church of St. Cross - the place where the urn with Chopin's heart has been placed; Viewing terrace.

STOP 6.

Where is it?

Stop number 6 is located in Świętokrzyska Street before the crossroad with Nicolaus Copernicus Street. From this point through Tamka Street we can get to Świętokrzyski Bridge.

What to see?

Chopin Museum; Mermaid Statue; The University Library; Copernicus Science Centre

STOP 7

Where is it?

This bus stop is located in Anielewicz Street, nearby the POLIN Museum of the History of Polish Jews. The museum is on the site of the former Warsaw Ghetto. Nearby is the Ibis Hotel.

What to see?

The POLIN Museum of the History of Polish Jews; Pawiak Prison; Jewish Cemetery; Powązki Cemetery

STOP 8

Where is it?

Stop 8 is located on Towarowa Street near the Warsaw Uprising Museum. The museum is dedicated to the 1944 Warsaw Uprising - one of the most important events in the history of Warsaw. Nearby are the JM Hotel, Platinum Residence, Hilton, Golden Tulip Hotel, Campanile Hotel and the Radisson Blu Sobieski Hotel

What to see?

The Warsaw Uprising Museum

STOP A.

Where is it?

Stop A is located in Królewska Street by the Royal Saxon Gardens. Nearby are the Sofitel Hotel, and Pilsudski Square, which hosts the majority of state ceremonies.

What to see?

Tomb of the Unknown Soldier; Saxon Garden Zachęta Gallery; The Grand Theatre National Opera

STOP B.

Where is it?

Stop B is in Nowy Świat Street near the de Gaulle Roundabout. The surrounding area is full of cafes, restaurants and shops.

What to see?

National Museum ; Polish Army Museum; National Stadium.

STOP C.

Where is it?

Stop C is located in Ujazdowskie Avenue next to the Monument of Pilsudski. In the gardens and parks, there is a lot of characteristic plants. Those visiting can relax in the charming alleys and listen to concerts of Chopin.

What to see?

Belvedere Palace, the seat of Polish President Botanical Garden; Ujazdów Castle; Astronomical Observatory; Palace on the Water; Theater on the Isle; Myslewski Palace; The Old Orangery; The New Orangery; Chopin Monument.

STOP D.

What is it?

Stop D is located on Marszałkowska street at Constitution Square.

What to see?

Constitution Square; Saviour Square; with the Saviour Church; Unia Lubelska Square with shopping center; many cosy restaurants and bars

STOP E.

Where is it?

Stop E is located in Jerozolimskie Avenue near the Omowski Roundabout. Nearby are the Novotel Hotel, Polonia Palace Hotel, and the Metropol Hotel. We invite you to visit the Palace of Culture and Science and shop in nearby stores.

What to see?

The Palace of Culture and Science; Rotunda; ShoppingCenter
