ETIHAD ANTIQUES MUSEUM

**4 ETIHAD ANTIQUES MUSEUM**  
The Etihad Museum is one of Abu Dhabi's hidden secrets, nestled away in the residential district of Al Bateen. The museum displays an array of exhibits that include 17th Century art, Ottoman Empire artefacts, pottery from B.C., a bow and arrow from one of Genghis Khan's Mongol empire, in addition to antiques and modern art. A visit is definitely recommended!

HERITAGE VILLAGE

**15 HERITAGE VILLAGE**  
This open museum is based on the reconstructions of a traditional oasis village which provides an interesting glimpse into the Emirate's past.  
See how the Bedouin's used to live in the desert. Includes a camfire with coffee pots, a goats' hair tent, and a falaj irrigation system.  
Days & Timings: ask staff for details.

ZAYED CENTER

**3 SHEIKH ZAYED CENTRE**  
This eclectic collection of artefacts and personal memorabilia documents the life of Sheikh Zayed, the founding father of the Emirates. The Museum exhibits photographs, intimate pieces, personal effects and cars including his 1970's model blue Mercedes that became synonymous with the beloved leader. The collection is housed in a rare assembly of old villas sporting traditional wind towers, on the coast of Al Bateen.

OBSERVATION DECK

**2 ETIHAD TOWERS**  
Located on level 74, the Observation Deck at 300 is the highest vantage point in Abu Dhabi and offers simply stunning views across the city and Arabian Gulf.  
Enjoy a 50% discount on entry fee with your Big Bus Abu Dhabi ticket. Just present your Big Bus ticket to Observation Deck staff to redeem your half price offer.

SHEIKH ZAYED GRAND MOSQUE

**17 SHEIKH ZAYED GRAND MOSQUE**  
This architectural masterpiece is a must-see for any visitor in Abu Dhabi.  
The Sheikh Zayed Grand Mosque is named after the founder and first President of the U.A.E., the late Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan. Based on his vision, the mosque was built with the rise of 11 metres above sea level, and 9.5 metres above the street level so that it is clearly visible from all directions.  
It is built as a monument to consolidate Islamic culture and a prominent centre for Islamic sciences. According to his wish, the Sheikh Zayed Grand Mosque is also the last resting place of its name giver.  
Both men and women are requested to dress moderately. Men need to wear pants, while the women need to cover their heads with a scarf and wear a long loose-fitting abaya. Intimate behaviour is not permitted inside the mosque.  
The mosque is closed to the public on Fridays
